Exactly the same way I use my daily letter to a language learning group: I will sometimes introduce new grammar, re-use vocab that needs revision etc....

Joyce, have you found it at all useful to write letters to your students in your Japanese university situation? There are so many things it is easier to say, using this channel, at least that is what I find. I ask you, as you were on the receiving end of my letters on the Multiple Intelligences course last year. Indeed you wrote me one or two letters yourself.

If anybody answers this letter, I am happy to begin a correspondence.
